MAY 7, 2020

The Conference Call was called to order at 8:00 PM by the Chairperson, Marjorie Moser. MINUTES - APRIL 8, 2020, CONFERENCE CALL: The Secretary read the minutes of the April 8, 2020 Conference Call. Motion was made (Drake/Pacelli) and passed that the minutes be accepted as printed/read.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jane Munn reported a balance on hand of \$21,149. Motion was made (Progin/Drake) and passed that the Treasurer's report be approved.

ZONE SHOW DISCUSSION:

- Marjorie reported that the Dream Park, at this time, is closed until the end of June. If the Dream Park continues to stay closed after that date, we will discuss our options at our June Conference Call.
- Discussion - possibly have a one day show added on the Friday before the Zone "two days" or have the Zone Show on Friday and Saturday with an additional one day show added on Sunday.
- Discussion: would folks be able to take an additional day off work in order to attend a three-day week-end event?
- Adding "open" classes to our show bill. Amy Seuss will pursue this possibility.
- Develop a survey to see how many exhibitors will be planning on coming to the show.
- What are the ramifications if we cancel the Zone Show at the "last minute"?
- What restrictions may the Dream Park be required to enforce this year?

Final comment: We will still "KEEP PLANNING UNTIL WE CAN'T DO ANYTHING MORE"!

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 PM with the next Conference Call scheduled for June 11, 2020, at 8:00 PM.
